'March' will end Dragon's run at PA's Alma Theater

"March," a play from the Dragon Productions Theater Company, is set to open on Nov. 9 and marks the last play by the company at their Palo Alto location.


The play centers around two lonely teenagers who meet online nightly to fight monsters, while their families struggle with real problems.

The play will open on Nov. 9 and runs until Dec. 2. Following the last day of the play the Dragon Theatre Company will move to its new location at 2120 Broadway in Redwood City.

The new theater will feature a larger space for the company, from the original seat count of 42 seats to 72 seats as well as a more ideal location in Redwood City.

The lobby will have separate concessions and ticket windows to dilute traffic and much needed new facilities will be available, including a studio, a backstage area, dressing rooms, bathrooms, a storage area and administrative offices.
